 - implementation of the Marshall Plan (1948)
 - launching of Sputnik (1957)
 - Bay of Pigs invasion (1961)
 - b) State whether the event you selected in (a) above was considered a Cold War victory or setback for the United States **and** provide a specific reason to support your evaluation.
 - c) Provide ONE significant lasting political or social outcome of the event you selected in (a) above.

Four "short-answer" questions appear on the APUSH National Exam. You are permitted a 40-minute period to answer three (restricted choice). Collectively, they comprise 20% of your final exam score.
